# ArchaeoWeeks in Ancient Roman Topography



ISAR proposes the following one-week program on Ancient Roman Topography with workshops in situ. The proposed program is ideal for a January term but may also be suitable from May to July.

The millennia-long history of Rome and the wealth of architectural heritage preserved here make it the perfect venue for an exciting week on the historical-topographical evolution of the city, from early historical time to the start of the middle ages.



## Program structure

The program's principal goal is first and foremost to improve the student's understanding of the ancient topography of Rome, from its foundation until its decline at the start of the middle ages. Such an understanding is aided greatly by discoveries made in the last century.

ISAR will allow students to learn more about the principles and methods of cultural heritage studies and Ancient Roman history. The program will take place in Rome, where beginning with orientation sessions, students will spend one week on site workshops and thematic lessons.

## Course Content

- From the city's origins to the regal period: Foro Romano, Palatino, Foro Boario
- The Roman Republic: Largo Argentina, the Tiber river Port.
- From Republic to Empire: Caesar's Forum
- August Urbanism. Campo Marzio, Cripta Balbi, and the Pantheon; Ara Pacis, Mausoleum and *Horologium* of Augustus.
- The Imperial Fori: Augustus, Pace, Transitorio and Trajan's Forum.
- The City and its Hinterland. South-eastern suburbs: Via Appia and via Latina: Tomb of Cecilia Metella, via Latina tombs, Mausoleo di Monte del Grano, villa delle Vignacce.
